R-5 ASSEMBLY





This is the only machine of its type imported from the USA.

The following day, participants visited Mark and Andrea Hannemann's on-farm water harvesting facility, Glenville Merino and Poll Merino stud and an entertaining afternoon at Ben and Kathy Ranford's property, getting an insight into Ben's cropping technology and future direction. The group were treated to a tour of Sims Farm and delved into it's extensive history with added anecdotes supplied by now retired Ag teacher, Paul Rowe.




