NEWS FROM THE AGRICULTURE FACULTY

Shearing week starts on Monday, 26th of August with Year 11 Agriculture students undertaking the farm's shearing. Our shearing team comprising Daniel Smart, Craig Blieschke, Cameron Tomney, Nathan Peters, Ellie Williams, Gavin Harvie, Zakirra Simpson and Ben Turner will be instructed by Mr Josh Sneath from TAFESA. We look forward to a busy and productive time of the year.

Year 8 and 9 students have again successfully raised and sold their batch of laying hens, lead by their teacher Annie Richter.

Year 11 Ag students attended Glenville's Ram sales where we bought 2 replacement rams. Many thanks to Glenville stud for again sponsoring our ram purchases and providing hogget classing and support towards our sheep enterprise.

Year 10 Ag students will attend the Uralba White Suffolk Ram sale despite us not requiring a ram this year. Year 12 Agriculture Production students Mackenley Harradine, Sophie Nuske and Ethan Tomney, supported by the Year 12 Ag Practical class have recently weighed and fat scored the Farm's prime lamb flock. Despite a very challenging year, we have managed to turn out some impressive first cross lambs at 465kgs average live weight and fat score 3.

You may have seen the Year 10's and the Royal Show wethers getting some exercise around town. We have made our final selection of 6 merino wethers, with on average live weight of 97.5kgs and our heaviest at 110kgs is still a lamb.

The team of Riley Evans, Renae Coulter, Chad Alcock, Taylah Haire, Courtney Grigg, James Nield, Britney Crosby and Hugh Hammat will leave Cleve on Tuesday 3rd of September with judging on the following day. This year, the Interschool Merino Wether Competition will be the feature breed and promises to be a spectacular and hard fought event. The entire Year 10 Ag class have done a sterling job of preparing the sheep team and deserve encouragement and best wishes for the show. Many thanks for the help and support of Robert Norris and Klay, Daryl and Barry Smith throughout this year long project.

We extend our best wishes for a successful showing effort to Year 11 and 12 Agriculture students—Lauren Ferme and Sophie Nuske who will compete at the Royal Adelaide Show Rural youth Judging Competition. They will be competing in sheep, cattle and fleece judging disciplines. It's good to see you 'having a go' and representing the school and its agriculture course.

NEWS FROM THE CANTEEN COMMITTEE...

Dear Parents,

Firstly, thank you for your patience with the restructuring of the school canteen. Change is frustrating but it's necessary in getting a better outcome for our school community.

Why a healthy canteen? Unfortunately, too many children do not have a healthy diet, and this has a negative effect on their growth, weight, development and learning.

Food provided at school has a considerable influence on the development of children's long-term eating habits, food preferences and attitudes towards food. The canteen plays a vital role in promoting healthy foods and creating a school culture of healthy eating. The school curriculum teaches healthy eating so it's vital that the school leads by example. Good nutrition is also linked to a better academic performance and we all want that!

The school have so many rules and regulations to abide by. In 2008 specific standards for South Australian schools banned the sale of unhealthy foods and drinks in SA schools and a set of guidelines (Right Bite Strategy) was introduced to help schools implement this. Being a small school with limited staff to introduce this, the CAS has to get the help of volunteers to implement programs like this successfully. The recently formed CAS Canteen Committee have looked closely into the guidelines and have worked hard to develop a policy and introduce the necessary changes. I would like to thank this group of passionate parents, teachers and students who have worked extremely well together to achieve this. A special thank you to Georgie Nagel for putting her hand up as Secretary. This Committee put out two surveys, one to parents and one to students to get their feedback and suggestions. Thank you to the large number of parents and students for filling out a survey. The feedback was vital and helped us make necessary decisions.

We have the Cleve Bakery on board providing a delicious selection of healthy foods and drinks. This is only available via a lunch order. For the older students who don't like filling in a lunch order the school are looking to introduce a lunch order app, so orders can be placed online before school starts.

We have a funky new menu thank you to Kelly Morrow from Figtree designs for volunteering her time to do this. A thank you must also go to the Front Office staff and Teachers for their patience and understanding during these changes.

We are still looking to open the canteen possibly a couple of days a week. If you know of anyone who would be interested in doing this (possibly for a fundraiser or their own business) please let Ray Marino or myself know.

We will trial the new system until the next Governing Council meeting and we are open to your feedback and suggestions.







Snapchat is an application which is free to download on iOS and Android devices that allows users to send images and videos 'snaps' to each other.

How does it work?

The receiver of the 'snap' can view it for up to 10 seconds (depending on what time the sender sets). After the allocated time the 'snap' will then 'dissolve'. If the receiver screenshots the snap the sender will be notified. Keep in mind there are ways around this ensuring that the sender doesn't get notified if a screen shot is taken, so keep in mind that nothing is private on Snapchat and everything is easily retrievable.

Concerns

Snapchat is the number one application used for 'sexting' or 'sending nudes' between underage people. Users must be mindful of the social and legal consequences of sending images like these. If the user is under 18 years old it is illegal for them to produce or possess these types of images. It is classed as child abuse images.

Child abuse pictures are illegal if they are:

- o asked for;
- o taken;
- o received and kept; or
- o sent, posted or passed around

These actions are a crime even if the picture is only of you, your boyfriend / girlfriend or someone else who says it's ok. Even if a picture is not child abuse material, asking for or sending a nude / sexy photo can be an indecent act and this is a crime. The maximum penalties for child abuse material can be up to 15 years in jail and being placed on the sex offender register. The maximum penalty for an act of indecency is 2 years in jail if the person in the picture is under 16. If the person is over 16, the maximum penalty is 18 months in jail. Privacy

Privacy settings that are available within Snapchat are the ability to restrict who can send a user photos or videos, 'snaps'. This can be enabled by going into the Settings menu, select 'Who can send me snaps', then select 'My friends'. This will ensure only people the user knows will be able to connect with them via the application. It is important to read the Snapchat privacy policy as it provides information about how the images and videos are stored and used. Users need to be aware that Snapchat has the right to reproduce, modify and republish photos and videos, and save them to the Snapchat servers, particularly in relation to the 'Live Story' feature.

Fortnite is an online gaming platform allowing up to 100 users per game to drop on to an island/map in the hunt for weapons and equipment. The users then hunt each other down in the hope to become number 1.

Battle Royale mode provided by epic games is free to download and available for everyone. Users have the choice to buy cosmetic items (micro transactions) which allows their character to look unique to others.

Concerns

Users are able to connect with other random users around the world. When holding down 'T' the game will allow the user to chat with any other user. This poses potentially inappropriate contact between users.

Be aware if your child is using your App Store / Google Play Store to play Fortnite they may be able to use the micro transaction function which will spend money off the linked credit card to the account.

How do I report / unfriend another user?

Users can report other users for harassment, inappropriate language, bullying and hacking.

To report

Fortnite recently updated their standard contact interface to accommodate player reports. Just click 'Email Us' and fill out the required fields. After selecting the Product and Game Mode, select Report Player as the Issue Type. This will make sure these reports are routed to the correct team.

A few helpful tips when reporting players:

Make sure to include the player(s) full in-game name, spelled as accurately as possible! If it looks like the player is using unusual or uncommon characters in their in-game name, screenshots are totally acceptable documentation. Speaking of screenshots: screenshots & video are incredibly useful for validation. If you captured

screenshots or videos of the offence, attach them. If you have links to streaming video of bad behaviour, include them!

If a user wants to delete a 'friend' within the game they can simply go to the icon on the top right of the screen with the three figures and select the user and click 'unfriend'. There is no way to block a user in the game. If a user is harassing another user they should follow the appropriate steps above to report them.

Make sure you talk to your child about appropriate behaviour whilst they are playing video games. It is never okay to bully or be mean to other players. If your child is getting bullied or harassed make sure they know that they can always come to you or a trusted adult for assistance.

If things get too intense within the game, make sure they know that they can always mute other players or simply leave the game. Your young person also needs to be aware to never disclose personal or private information to other users within the game and to only talk to people about the game itself.

Parent Update Week 5, Term 3 - 2019

Year 7 will be taught in high school from term 1, 2022.

This means from 2022, year 6 will be the last year of primary school and year 7 will be the first year of high school.

This is a big change for our public education system. We'll be providing regular updates about the move and what it means for your child.

Why we're moving year 7

Year 7 is already part of high school across the country, so we're bringing South Australia in line with the rest of Australia, and with other education systems in our state.

The planning process

We'll be ready for the move in 2022. We've done our homework to make sure there's enough space at high schools. We're investing \$185m in our schools to manage increasing enrolments, which includes providing general and specialist learning areas.

Benefits for your child

Your child's learning is our priority and we want to make sure they get the best learning opportunities from their new high school environment.

The Australian Curriculum for year 7 was designed to be taught in high school, and your child will benefit from specialist teachers in specialist high school facilities.

We can see in many of our R – 12 schools, and from the interest in our pilot schools, that year 7s are ready and keen for high school.
