

A two-woman team of Year 8 students from Cleve Area School has taken home the national title at the Brilliant Business Kids Festival!

Cleve Area School students Georgia Macgowan, 14, of Darke Peak, and Jorja Newlyn, 14, of Cleve, pitched their winning concept for a solar-powered water sensor and app in Sydney last week, in front of a national audience. The students were part of a Semester-long entrepreneurial learning program sponsored by Agrifutures and startup.business which saw them pair with local mentors to identify key issues in the agriculture industry.

Cleve Area School was the only South Australian school to win a spot in the prestigious program which focuses on fostering leaders in agriculture through industry mentorship and design thinking.

Georgia and Jorja learned about the time spent checking livestock water troughs on large or isolated farms, and the many factors which might stop a sheep or other stock from drinking water.

While other products can alert a farmer to water leaks, and cameras can warn of low water levels or debris in troughs, the girls' design also tests for some of the chemical factors which deter or damage animals - including high nitrogen, salinity or alkalinity.

The students' **'Handy Trough'** app, which receives alerts from a sensor located in each trough, is designed to save farmers time, money, stock, keep them off rural roads for longer and relieve the mental stress of livestock upkeep.

Cleve Area School's involvement in, and support of, the 2019 Agrifutures program and young Ag-Preneurs is just one more indication of the school's commitment to fostering leaders in the Australian agricultural industry through hands-on learning in real-world contexts, and vocational partnerships with industry leaders. Cleve Area School is home to the award-winning Sims Farm, Australia's top dryland farming school enterprise.

The Agrifutures program was supported financially by the District Council of Cleve, Port Lincoln 4WD, Primary Industries Education Foundation of Australia (PIEFA), Rudall Motors, Deloshanda Merino and Poll Merino Stud and Rabobank.

The news of Georgia and Jorja's win came close on the heels of Cleve being named 2019 Ag Town of the Year, and fellow Cleve Certificate in Agriculture student Sophie Nuske being named SA School-Based Apprentice of the Year, in what has proven to be a year full of wins for Cleve Area School.

“At DOE our Team is committed to the enhancement of our Patients' Oral and General Health through the provision of Quality Dental Care to the Community.”

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Dear parents and caregivers,

Dental on Eyre provides free school dental care each year through the School Dental Service Scheme and Child Dental Benefit Scheme. Next year, we will NOT be providing this service. Dr Cindy Dennis has been advocating strongly for support to recruit oral health professionals to rural areas. Despite this, from January 2020 there will be no dentist.

On 26<sup>th</sup> - 29<sup>th</sup> November 2019 Dental On Eyre, in partnership with MARS WRINGLEY FOUNDATION, conducted a fluoride education and delivery program called Smiles On Eyre at Cleve Area School, Cleve District Children's Centre, Wudinna Area School, Cowell Area School, Cowell Early Learning Childhood Centre and Kimba Area School. 500 children from preschool to year 7 watched a presentation on oral health and fluoride and children who participated in the Smiles on Eyre program received fluoride varnish. Each child received an educational pack including a USB of the presentation, along with a tooth brush, tooth paste and floss to take home and show their family. Please ask your children about the program, you may wish to watch the presentation with them.

Education, prevention and support is where oral health begins. Good oral and dental hygiene is important as it can help prevent bad breath, tooth decay and gum disease. It can help you keep your teeth as you get older and prevent other medical and health complications.

Without a dentist in the region programs like these are not possible.
