I take this opportunity to thank Mrs Agars for the enormous amount of work she does in our school, her dedicated leadership and passion she has for teaching. Mrs Agars will be based at Cleve and will work in schools across our partnership on the Eyre Peninsula. We will select an Acting DP within the first two weeks of this term.

I also take this opportunity to thank the following staff who have completed contracts during 2019. Mikeala Irwin on Maternity leave, Jack Kenny, working in the private sector, Chris Overton, moved back to Adelaide and now working at Charles Campbell R-12 School, Georgina Stutley is now working at Streaky Bay AS, Jo Primer working as a Nanny on a station in the Flinders Ranges.

#### Mobile Phone/Devices Policy Trial:

By now you may have heard that the School Governing Council, at the last meeting decided, after extensive consultations with students, staff & parents, to introduce a **No Mobile Phone Use** during the school day. In addition to the information gained from the consultation, the committee also looked at trials conducted in other schools and the current research on how mobile phones contribute to cyber-bullying and distract student learning when used inappropriately. As part of this policy we are asking all students to either leave their phones at home, hand the phone in at the home group period by placing the phone in a dedicated storage file or place it in their bags and **NOT ACCESS THE PHONE DURING THE DAY**. The storage file will be housed in the front office area.

In an emergency, students can go to the front office and obtain permission to contact parents. We ask parents not to ring students during lesson time. A few parents of senior students, studying Agriculture, have contacted us regarding the use of phones at Sims Farm. We will take their issues to a Sims Farm Operations Committee meeting next Monday to discuss ways that we may be able to cater for their needs. If you have an issue or need further information please contact me by phone, email or in person by making an appointment through the front office. The front office team support the policy trial and their role is to follow the policy procedures. Any issues or concerns need to be taken up with me or members of the leadership team in a professional and appropriate manner, using our CREW values. Please remember CREW values are for students, staff and parents, so we can all show care, respect and consideration for each-other.

The Canteen will remain closed at this stage and we will continue with the ordering system used last year with the Cleve Bakery. We had a very smooth start to this year. At the assembly on Monday we introduced our Year 12 students, the new Reception students, new staff and students new to our school. We also talked about our CREW values. I believe the scene is set for another successful year so please work with us to ensure that Cleve Area School continues to be “**A Great Place to Learn**”.

Applying online is easy! Simply follow the steps below.

- STEP 2** Select the type of School Card you would like to apply for (for example 'Type A') and follow the prompts.
- STEP 3** Complete all mandatory fields.  
*Please note: you cannot submit your application unless all mandatory fields are complete.*
- STEP 4** Once you have completed a page click on the 'NEXT' button.
- STEP 5** Once you have filled out all pages click the 'SUBMIT' button.  
*Please note: if you exit the form without clicking 'SUBMIT' your details will be lost.*

You can save the form, and return to complete it at another time, by clicking on the 'SAVE' button.







Dear Parent/Caregivers,

Materials and Services charges for 2020 have been set by the Governing Council and are \$315 for R-7 students and \$395 for 8-12 Students. There is an additional subject charge for students enrolling in the Agricultural Course and Wood/Metal subjects. Families with two children will pay two full fees while families with more than two children will pay two full fees, with a 15% discount on fees for the third and subsequent children. Some examples are set out below.

#### Year 10, 11 and 12 Agriculture/Wood & Metal Tech

trips and an Agricultural Camp as an integral part of their programme.


*Year 10 - \$50, Year 11 & 12 \$100. There is also an additional cost for the purchasing of extra wood and metal products for student projects throughout the year.*

#### Year 12 Additional Material

Year 12 students will also be required to pay additional fees throughout the year for study guides and essential reference material. This amount will vary between \$20.00 and \$90.00 (approx.) depending on subjects studied.

#### Why Materials & Services Charges Are Essential

Materials and Services charges together are a very important component of the school budget. They are used to purchase text and reference books, equipment, materials for learning, including stationery. All books and materials issued to students remain the property of the school.

**Payment by instalment can be negotiated with the school if there is a difficulty in settling your account. Please contact the school as soon as possible to discuss a payment plan.**


Cheques should be crossed "Not Negotiable" and made payable to Cleve Area School Governing Council Inc.
