Covid-19 update: Firstly I want to take this opportunity to thank all our parents for being very supportive in our efforts to follow all the COVID-19 restrictions and protocols throughout last term. You would also be aware that the state government has relaxed some restrictions so that we can now have excursions, assemblies and resume some sporting activities.
