HELLO EVERYONE,





OPERATION FLINDERS

A new direction for young people at risk

2020



In Week 3 five Year 10 students from both Cleve Area School and Cowell Area School along with two Support Staff embarked on the Annual Operation Flinders Foundation Exercise. Students Joshua Yeates, Tom Proctor, Claira Weiss, Brock Lawrie and Seth Hutchins from Cleve were selected to undertake the eight day journey through the Flinders Ranges with the aim of walking 100+ kilometres over mountainous, undulating terrain. During the walk across the countryside these students would undertake a variety of different activities and challenges that were aimed to push them to their mental and physical limits. On Tuesday after a long 5 hour drive, Shane “Bucks” ‘Shaneo” Buckley their team leader and “Friendly” “Thirteeeeeeen” Grant their Assistant Team Leader (ATL) pushed them off the bus and after a furious rush to unpack their “civilian” bags and re-pack their rucksacks with the bare essentials, they (or TANGO 2 as they were named) set off across dry Yankaninna Station. What followed was eight days of long grueling walks across beautiful but dry scenery, completing many activities including; setting up their beds called “hoochies”, Abseiling down giant cliff faces, hiking up a variety of mountains and ridges, team building and thought provoking exercises, visiting ancient aboriginal sites, navigating with compass and map, cooking the canned-food delights, lighting camp fires with flint and steel, and the ever popular digging and filling in the pit for the “thunder-box”. After a few days getting to know each other you could barely tell there was two schools, as each student was able to adapt and cooperate with their new found friends quickly, and all the TANGO 2 members, with a determined smile, faced each challenge head-on. It was great to see each student overcome their own limitations and to see them grow in confidence as each day passed. As they faced new challenges, they were forced to think about the problem in a fresh way in order to complete it. Each student portrayed the many qualities needed to complete Operation Flinders successfully, and held themselves to a high standard through-out the experience. They represented Cleve Area School in an extremely positive manner, although the smell on the bus on the way home left something to be desired.
