PBL HEALTH EDUCATION PROGRAMS

TAKE HOME MESSAGES WEEKS 4, 5, 6 AND 7 OF TERM 4

YEARS 6 / 7

CONCEPTION (KS: CPC)

The male and female reproductive systems consist of a series of parts that work together. One of their functions is to produce the male and female sex cells (sperm and eggs) and enable reproduction to occur. For most people, the reproductive system becomes mature during puberty. By knowing the names and functions of the parts that make up the reproductive systems, I am better able to understand and care for my body and reproductive health.

CONTRACEPTION

There are many types of contraception available and they work in different ways to prevent pregnancy. Most contraception works by preventing an egg and sperm from meeting so fertilisation cannot occur, or by changing the conditions in the uterus to prevent conception. People are able to seek medical advice to help them choose the type of contraception that is best for them. It is important that I know where I can go for correct information and advice about contraception when the time comes.

YEARS 8 / 9

LESSON 8: DOES POPULAR CULTURE INFLUENCE HOW WE SEE OURSELVES

Everyday popular culture presents us with sexualised images of popular and famous people. These images can impact negatively on how we see ourselves and the person we want to be. These messages are often in conflict with the characteristics that make a person unique and the characteristics we respect and value in other people. It is important that we critically analyse how popular culture may impact on us and focus on what makes us unique and feel good about ourselves. It is also important to value friends for who they are, the relationships you have with them, and not how they look or how popular they are.

LESSON 9: RELATIONSHIP QUALITIES (KS: CPC)

We have many relationships in our lives. Relationships are unique and complex; they have the potential to create a lot of joy, but can also cause hurt. They are very important to our self-esteem and sense of belonging. I can identify the qualities that I value in relationships and what qualities I can offer to relationships.

LESSON 10: WHAT IS LOVE?

Peer pressure, stereotypes and inexperience make it hard for a young person to understand how to act, enjoy and feel safe in a loving relationship. Sharing feelings and ideas with others, such as family and friends, helps me to develop that understanding.

LESSON 11: SEXTING AND CYBERBULLYING (KS: CPC)

Child pornography is a film, photograph or publication or computer game that describes or portrays a minor who is, or appears to be, represented in an indecent sexual manner or context. I now understand that it is a criminal offence to produce, procure, possess, transmit and/or supply this type of material. It is important to recognise that my use of ICT resources can impact on the social and emotional wellbeing of others and for me to understand that I have ethical obligations and responsibilities as a cyber/digital citizen.

YEARS 10 / 11 / 12

LESSON 8: IF I WERE BEN – UNPLANNED PREGNANCY

The decision an individual or couple makes about an unplanned pregnancy is not easy. It is personal and very much determined by an individual's values, circumstances and the support available. It is important that people have accurate information about how best to avoid an unplanned pregnancy, that they respect the rights of people to make their own choices and that they know where they can go for help and support.

LESSON 9: ABUSE OF POWER IN INTIMATE RELATIONSHIPS (KS: CPC)

An abuse of power in relationships can be physical, social, emotional, financial or sexual. No one deserves to be in an abusive relationship. A positive and loving relationship is respectful, and power is used in positive ways. Very often in a relationship there are early warning signs that a person is going to continue to be abusive. People can work together to challenge an abuse of power in relationships. Abusive relationships can be hard to leave but there are people who can support someone to leave. There is also support for perpetrators of violence.

LESSON 10: RESPECTFUL RELATIONSHIPS CONTINUUM (KS: CPC)

Understanding what a respectful and disrespectful relationships looks and feels like is important. Leaving disrespectful relationships can be hard. But we do not have to stay in a relationship where we are not being/feeling respected. Being able to seek help when a relationship is disrespectful is an important life skill.




