# CLEVE AREA SCHOOL NEWSLETTER

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## HELLO EVERYONE

The term seems to be keeping us all very busy as we work together in providing a quality educational service to the Cleve community.

On Friday May 14th our school participated in **Walk Safely to School day**. We encouraged staff, students and even parents to at least walk part of the way to school. This activity helped to promote the physical benefits of walking and safe pedestrian behaviour. Buses dropped the students at the Cleve Show Grounds and students walked to school with staff and parents along the main street. I thank all the people who took part in this event.

**The Governing Council** is an important school decision making group and is one of the avenues that parents and the community can have a real say in the decision making process of our school. The School Council meets twice per term and subcommittees meet as the need arises. I encourage all parents/caregivers to contact any member of the Governing Council and have your say. We appreciate feedback, especially constructive comments that will help us to provide a high quality educational service to our community. **Student Free day:** The School Governing Council has granted a student free day so staff can be involved in learning about the new Curriculum Resources that the Department has produced for our teachers. This will be held on the last day of term Friday July 2<sup>nd</sup>. I thank the School Governing Council for the continued support of our staff.

Last Thursday, a number of our students travelled to Pt. Lincoln for the **Football & Netball Challenge**. Many thanks to all the students who participated, the parents who helped and the staff who supervised the groups. Thanks also to Mr Byrnes for organising our school's involvement in this event.

Last Wednesday our school was involved in **Simultaneous Story Time**. I thank Jo Turner and the students who performed on the day.

Our **CREW values** of: Care, Respect, Enthusiasm for learning and Working together are helping us to prepare our students for the future. However sometimes the new technologies of internet, mobile phones and related devices can create issues for all of us. The school and the department have filters that scan and inform us when a person is accessing inappropriate material. We get an alert and then follow this up with the individual. As parents I ask you to discuss these issues with your children and ensure that you are aware of the material that your child may be exposed to when working on the internet, either by phone or other device. We need to ensure that all our children are safe from cyber-bullying and inappropriate material.

As a school staff we have noticed that there are far too many students, leaving the school at lunchtime with **lunch passes** signed by parents. We also have reports that many students are accessing social media via their

mobile phones, once out of the school grounds. One reason that the school canteen is no longer operational is that children were not purchasing healthy food. Our sign-out records show that about 20 students a day sign out to leave the school at lunchtime. We also know that only 2 or 3 go home. The others go to the Bakery, the Roadhouse or Foodland. I have had reports from community members that they see our students in large groups in the shops and streets at lunchtime.

In addition to the message that this sends to the community, we as a staff, are concerned about the safety aspect of having students unsupervised. We are also worried about the fact that many students are bringing back snacks, high energy drinks and sweets from the supermarket.

To this end we will review our current lunch-pass policy and procedures for leaving school at lunchtime. We will ask students to use the ordering system that the Primary classes are using to order lunch from the Bakery. Trevor and I will speak with the students this week about this issue and will take the issue to the SRC and School Governing Council. We seek your support in this matter. If you have signed a lunchtime pass for your child/children, I ask you to have a discussion about this topic at home. Please contact me or Trevor if you have any concerns, suggestions and constructive ideas to resolve this situation.

The **NAPLAN** tests were administered for students in years 3, 5, 7 and 9. During week 3 of this term There was a considerable amount of planning, organisation and follow-up during the days of the tests. Especially this year as students completed most of the tests on line in our computer rooms. I want to thank the staff for the very professional approach to these tests. I also thank Mr. McDonough and Mrs Ramsey for their work leading up to, during and after the tests. I can confidently say that we followed all the required protocols for administering the tests.

# TRP@HOME

The notion of family in Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander cultures is closely tied to themes of connectedness and kinship. In this setting, family structures are pivotal to identity formation, understanding one's own spiritual and cultural belonging, and assists in establishing strong links with community. Ultimately, family and kinship are a cohesive force that bind Aboriginal people together.

To facilitate more positive conversations as a family, the below questions have been developed to help families practise the GEM principles daily within conversation. They are a great way to build deeper connections as your family shares a meal either in the morning, afternoon or evening or at a time that works best. Here are some great GEM CHAT questions and ideas to get you started;

- Remember someone who has done something **kind** for you recently. What did they do for you? How did this make you feel?
- What is your perspective? Can you put yourself in **someone else's shoes and** understand their point of view?
- Who is someone you know who may be experiencing some difficulty currently? What could we do for them as a family?
- What is something **kind** you are going to do for someone today?



National Reconciliation Week (NRW) is a time for all Australians to learn about our shared histories, cultures, and achievements, and to explore how each of us can contribute to achieving reconciliation in Australia. The dates for NRW remain the same each year; 27 May to 3 June. These dates commemorate two significant milestones in the reconciliation journey—the successful 1967 referendum, and the High Court Mabo decision respectively. Reconciliation Australia’s theme for 2021, More than a word. Reconciliation takes action, urges the reconciliation movement towards braver and more impactful action. We all have a role to play when it comes to reconciliation, and in playing our part we collectively build relationships and communities that value Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples, histories, cultures and futures.

The staff and students at Cleve Area School would like to acknowledge the land that we play on, learn on and live on as the traditional lands of the Barngarla people.


We would like to pay respect to Elders past and present and extend that respect to all other Indigenous people who are present.

Our next meeting is on


**June 3<sup>rd</sup>, 12noon at the Cleve Hotel.**
