This will help us with our staffing requirements and class group placements. At this stage our student enrolments numbers for 2022 are very similar to 2021. We expect our resourcing from the Department for Education and parent contributions to be similar so staffing should also be the same. This assumes that no more families are leaving or students are being sent away from Cleve for their secondary years of schooling.

I would like to start this week with a special thanks to the Social Committee at the school for organising Ray's community farewell. It was a great evening filled with laughter and of course music! On the day we also spent time reviewing and reflecting on our current practices within the school so we can continue to have discussions with everyone within our school community about our schools future directions. For me, it was by far one of the most useful and informative days of Professional Development that I have had the opportunity to attend. So a big thanks to the school community for allowing us to have had this opportunity.

Last Friday the whole school were involved in the Walk to the Weir event. It was really well organised with the 'talking points' along the way. I enjoyed chatting with students along the way and getting to know more about them. I also managed to clock up over 7000 steps!
