

Swimming Carnival

The Year 4-12 Swimming Carnival is on Friday, 4th March. The last few carnivals have been extremely close with the last few races deciding the final placings for the top positions. After Nurrugy House took home the shield in 2020 to end Cooranga's dominance, Corranga fought back last year to reclaim the title. Kahibah House were again great at practices and out of the pool to claim 'back to back' Swimming Carnival Team Spirit Awards! The Team Spirit Award shield is awarded throughout the year at each house sporting competition. Students are judged on how well they participate,

cheer and support their team. Students are encouraged to dress up in their team colours at the carnival and come up with chants/war cries. However, a standard of dress suitable for attendance at a school function and swimming is required and because of the effect on chemical levels, students are asked not to put dyes in hair and to ensure any 'body paint' applied is safe.

Students will meet at the pool at 8.50 a.m. for Home Group whilst competition commences at 9.05 a.m. and concludes in time for the usual departure of buses. There will be a lunch break from approximately 12.30pm - 1.00pm. Catering will be provided at the pool on the day with final details regarding menus and prices promoted over the next week. The Program will be posted on the school Facebook site whilst hard copies will be available to interested parents from today, at the front office, or at Swimming Carnival.

The Swimming Carnival is a normal school day and all students are expected to attend.

We hope you are able to support the occasion by attending for at least part of the day. For many years now we've had a great number of spectators which has created an exciting atmosphere for the students.

- A reminder that any person (child, student, staff member, or family member) who is unwell or symptomatic (even mildly) **must not** attend the school site or any associated event.
- Adults must continue physical distancing of 1.5 metres whenever and wherever possible. This requirement does not apply to people who live together.
- Physical distancing requirements do not apply to children, however, they are still strongly encouraged to maintain good hand hygiene and use non-contact forms of greeting.
- All adults (including staff and parents) entering the site must check-in by scanning the QR code or completing the paper recording log template.
- All volunteers / officials must be doubled vaccinated.

To help clarify queries about the Swimming Carnival the following is an outline of how the day is organised. The carnival is split into the following:

Individual Championship Events

Races designed to cater for 'stronger' swimmers with one competitor from each house in each race swimming: Freestyle, Breast Stroke, Butterfly (Inter and Senior only) and Backstroke.

- All races are 34m (2laps)

Individual Medley (Backstroke, Breaststroke, Freestyle)

- Sub Junior and Junior are 17m (1 lap) each leg
- Inter and Senior is 34m (2 laps) each leg.

Age Events

Races designed for all competitors regardless of their swimming ability. An unlimited number of competitors are able to compete in heats at the start of the day. The fastest four swimmers in each stroke, in each age group, regardless of house, go through to a final. All races are 17m (1 lap) - all age groups do Breast Stroke, Backstroke and Freestyle.

Team Novelty Events

Races designed first and foremost to encourage non-swimmers and beginner swimmers to 'have a go'.

- Ring Relay - mixed teams for sub junior and junior
- Tube Relay - mixed teams for sub junior, junior, intermediate and senior
- Peg Scramble - mixed teams for sub junior, junior and intermediate
- Ball Dribble - mixed teams for intermediate and senior
- Chariot Race - mixed sub junior and senior combined.

Relays

Team Freestyle and Medley relays with teams of four competitors from each house.

- Sub junior and junior legs are 17m, intermediate and senior are 34m

House meetings will be held next Tuesday to enable Leaders to finalise teams. Every effort is made by House Captains, Vice Captains and supervising teachers to ensure all students are able to participate in at least three events. Hopefully

an individual's events will be spread out throughout the day but this isn't always possible. Primary students will record their events in diaries after House Meetings.

Sports Day Trials and Practices

The school's annual Sports Day for all students in Years 4-12 will be held on Friday 18 March at the school oval.

Preparation for this year will follow the same format as previous, which overall, has proved very successful.

On Tuesday 9 March, Wednesday 10 March and Thursday 11 March, from 9.00 until 11.10 am, students will be given the opportunity to participate in trials/practices and earn 'standard points' for their House on Sports Day. They will be in House groups, with an "expert" staff member at specific events to instruct and coach as appropriate.

If you would like to watch the trials or you are able to assist in any way (coaching, supervision, and recording), please let one of the front office staff know and I will contact you. However, please keep in mind COVID rules apply and, if you volunteer, you will need to be vaccinated.

The aim of the trials is to provide maximum individual participation and, at the same time, identify, encourage and develop the talented athletes in Years 4-12. It is necessary to provide block time for House Captains and supervising staff to select competitors and to prepare for the day generally. Since many of our students travel on buses and other valuable programmes are offered during lunch breaks; some school time has been set aside.

Under the circumstances the training plan needs full co-operation. Staff will expect students to participate in order to gain maximum benefit and assist House Officials to select teams. House performance (leadership, team work, cooperation, behaviour, participation etc) on these days will also contribute to the Sports Day's 'Team Spirit Award'.

We would appreciate your support for these arrangements and ask that you encourage your child(ren) to take part and give their best in each event. If there are extenuating circumstances preventing your child from participating, please provide the school with a brief explanatory note.

In the final part of The Resilience Project's digital series, Hugh shares an important message about allowing our children to experience adversity.





Photon Energy

Yadnarie Solar Power and Energy Storage Facility Community Information Sessions

Photon Energy is proposing to construct a solar power and energy storage renewable energy development approximately 7 kilometres west of Cleve (Yadnarie).

What's Being Proposed?

Photon Energy NV (Photon Energy) in partnership with RayGen Resources Pty Ltd (RayGen), propose to utilise RayGen's unique solar power (PV Ultra solar cogeneration) and electricity storage (Thermal Hydro storage) technology to generate solar power and store energy at Yadnarie, west of Cleve.

The technology proposed and scale of electricity storage is new to the South Australian renewable energy sector. The development proposed is a facility with 300 MW of solar generation, 150MW grid connection and 3.6 Gigawatt hours of storage, equivalent to 24 hours of dispatchable energy.

A capital investment of approximately \$750 million is anticipated to develop the project, which will create approximately 20 direct ongoing jobs for the Cleve area once operational.
