

## Principal News

Hope everyone is keeping as well as possible at the moment. I know there has been Covid, colds and gastro to deal with lately. Surely, we are going to be able to get everyone back on deck soon and recommence back to, as close as normal, as possible. Hang in there!!

Thanks to all parents for juggling your kids with all of the above mentioned and your own work and family commitments. It hasn't been easy and everyone is trying their best to keep everyone else in the community as safe and healthy as possible. Big thumbs up (emoji controls aren't working!).

As you would all be aware, the masks are now only strongly recommended for all staff (if fully vaccinated) and students in years 3-12. If any staff member or student prefers to wear mask, we certainly support them in their decision to look after their health. For unvaccinated staff, the conditions remain the same, they are required to undertake a RAT each day before work and wear a mask at all times whilst indoors at school.

To support our staff and students, we would ask that all parents and visitors, who come into the school or community library, continue to wear masks when they visit. The students and staff have been very disciplined during the recent restrictions, by wearing their masks and socially distancing and we don't want to undo all this hard, whilst we transition into no masks. We would like to monitor the situation on site for a couple of weeks, to see what happens, before we allow all visitors to not wear masks. We thank you in anticipation of your support of our students and staff members.

I have been witnessing some powerful learning of late as I wander through classrooms. Teachers are providing engaging work which has multiple entry points, and students are focussing on their work and producing work to a high standard demonstrating their understanding of the topics being covered. If your child has recently missed some school because a myriad of reasons, and you have any concerns about their learning, please contact their classroom or subject teacher and check in with them.

The Student Free Day which was postponed from this Friday for the Partnership, has been rescheduled for Friday 8th July (Week 10 of Term 2). As soon as the Governing Council have had the opportunity to ratify that this date is suitable for our staff to attend, we will confirm the date. The day will support our staff to further develop their understanding of the DfE Units of Work, and how to best utilise this new curriculum resource in the classroom.



The football team competed in a pool of 3 schools in Division 2. They quickly gelled together to get off to a great start against Tumbly Bay and record a 40 point win. In the second game we played Navigators and after getting off to a slow start and trailing by 3 goals, we began to link up and move the ball with efficiency into the forward lines. It was an even contest in the slippery conditions but we managed to control enough of the play to run out winners by 10 points.

This year there were 29 teams competing in 2 divisions of Netball from 9 schools across Eyre Peninsula. 

# NEW BOOKS

# INTRODUCING READING TARGETS



## What is a target?

Reading targets will be an approach across R-6 to individually target students reading, set home reading expectations, focus on a consistent approach and track our students improvement.

## How?

Teachers will set targets for students from their star reader diagnostic report each term. A letter to families will go home outlining the target. Teachers will check diaries for home reading 3 x a week and if a student has not read they will go to reading catch up at lunchtime on Friday.



## Why students think its important?

Creates a comfortable struggle.  
Individual goals and easy to track.  
Ability to keep checking in.  
Enjoyment of reading

## How it will be achieved?

5 words or more wrong on a page - too tricky!  
Too easy - you won't progress!  
Quizzes each week 2 minimum - push yourself if you are reading smaller books.


