The External School Review is now upon us (we have been waiting a while with COVID interruptions!). The first part is happening this afternoon with a round table discussion, via TEAMS, about our previous progressions from the last review in 2019. The second aspect is the planning for what the lines of inquiry will be when the reviewers visit the school in week 5. Jordan and I are looking forward to discussing the progress we have made within the school since 2019, and then being supported to discover what areas should be our next focus so we can confidently continue the improvement journey we have been on.

While reflecting on the progress we have made as a school, we were looking at where we have gained our improvement and the impact this has had on our students and their learning. One measure of this improvement is the results we receive from the NAPLAN testing. We are very pleased with the results which our students achieved this year (still work to do, but..) as it demonstrates that we are on a positive trajectory in our improvement work.

This year our Year 3 cohort had 39% in High Bands in both Reading and Numeracy, whilst our Year 5 cohort had 30% in Reading and 25% in Numeracy. This is a really solid achievement and reaffirms the work we have been undertaking across the school since 2019. Our Year 7 cohort (9% in High Bands in Reading and 13% in Numeracy) and our Year 9's (10% in Reading and 5% in Numeracy) are reflective of current State and National data. Whilst at first glance we could be slightly disappointed with this, when we break the data down further we discover that we now have more students this year who are closer to High Bands than in the past. This means that we have supported students to achieve at a higher level, but they haven't quite achieved High Bands. They are however achieving at or above the expected level for their year level.

The other part of our data this year shows that we have had a decrease in the number of students who are below SEA (Student Educational Achievement) level for their year level. These results are informing our decision making on the intervention programs we provide. It informs us of the students who we need to focus our attention on to ensure they have a solid understanding of their literacy and numeracy, as these are important foundational skills to have in their futures.

As a result of this intentional focus on our teaching practices and the students learning at Cleve over the past few years, we feel that we are on that positive trajectory of supporting all our students to improve their learning outcomes every year. We strategically don't rely on a single set of data to inform our teaching practice. We are ensuring that we have regular check-ins on our student's progress and then are hitting their immediate needs when they identified. We have become much better at identifying and catching students up on their learning holes, so they have that solid foundation in their learning and can then take their learning to the next level required.

Wow, this review has really got me thinking about where we have come from and where we want to go. I can't wait for us to continue this journey together. This is also a good time to mention that we need you to be part of this journey. I always put at the end of my article to contact us when you need too. I want to really reiterate that this is a really important part of the process and we need you to keep us informed of things

which you feel we can improve at or want to give a shout for something that is really good that has happened. It's amazing the effect of receiving some positive news that lets a chest get puffed out for a while and the positive ripple that can have.

Please also keep an eye out in a couple of weeks where there will be an opportunity for you to book a time to come in and see me or Jordan (or both of us) to have a chat about any bug bears or new ideas you may have that will support us to continue to provide the best opportunities for our students.

As we continue to plan for 2023, please let us know if your child is not returning to Cleve next year. The final enrolment numbers affect our staffing plans. Also, if you know of anyone intending on enrolling, get them to contact us so we can help make this transition for them smooth.

As always (and I mean it), if you have any queries throughout the year please Dojo, email or phone your class teacher, Jordan Hooper or myself. We would prefer to know about something which is concerning you rather than not. This way we can do something about it and make the situation better for all involved.






