Discount

Families with two children will pay two full fees while families with more than two children will pay two full fees with a 15% discount on fees for the third and subsequent children. The discount will only apply if families pay all their M & S fees less discount in Term 1 2023.

DEPUTY PRINCIPAL NEWS

I would like to welcome everyone new and returning, to the 2023 school year. We have lots of new staff, students and families joining our school and I think we are already seeing the benefits of some fresh perspectives. Hats

The school policy is for broad-brim hats to be worn year-round (not just Terms 1 & 4) when students are outside. Please make sure your child has a suitable hat at school every day, otherwise they will be required to stay in designated undercover areas during break times. The school uniform shop has hats available for purchase if required. If we are lucky enough to get some warmer weather the students also have access to sunscreen for further protection.

Naplan

Naplan has arrived early, shifting from its traditional time during Term 2 to mid Term 1. Years 3,5,7 & 9 students will complete the first component, Writing, on Wednesday Week 7 (15/3), and the remaining components before Monday, Week 9 (27/3). If you have children in these year levels please try to keep these dates free so that the data collected can give us the best representation of our students' progress.

Student Home Internet Program

The student home internet program can provide internet access to students who do not have reliable home internet, so they can continue to learn and study at home. You can find out more about the program and how parents and carers can apply by visiting the department's website.

BYOD (Student Laptops)

I have recently shared information with our newer secondary families on the school's BYOD program, which allows them to use a device of their choice on the school network. 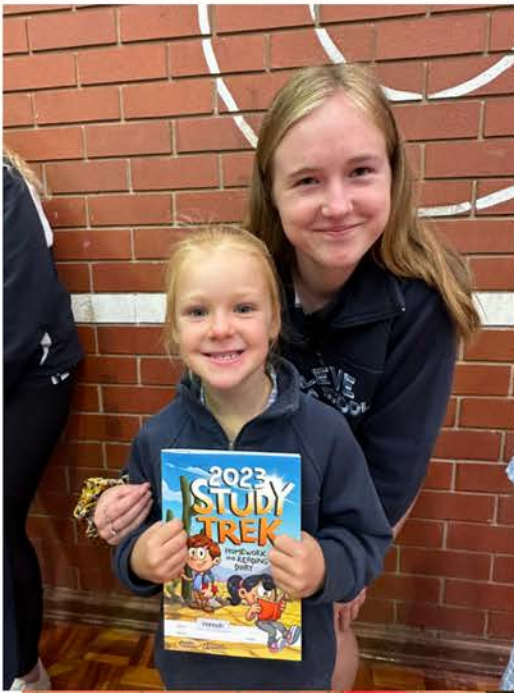

WHAT IS SCHOOL CARD?



School Card provides financial help to cover the cost of school fees.

WHO CAN APPLY?

To qualify for School Card, your family's income must be below a specific limit. This limit depends on how many children are in your care.

You must also meet at least one of the following:

- have a child or children aged four years or over who attend a school full time
- be an independent full-time student studying year 10, 11 or 12
- be an adult re-entry student undertaking subjects to complete SACE (years 11 and 12).

HOW WILL I KNOW IF I AM APPROVED?

After you apply, you will receive a letter in the mail advising if your application has been approved. Please note, School Card is not a student identification card.
