
















It was great to have author Fleur McDonald visit us in the library last week. It was fantastic to see so many community members attend. Thanks to Emma for organising this great community event!

## Will you answer the call? Join the Cleve or Elliston Volunteer Ambulance Team today.

SA Ambulance Service has launched its recruitment campaign Answer the Call and is looking for more volunteers in your region.

More than 1200 volunteers provide ambulance services in 80 locations across the state, including at Cleve and Elliston.

The Cleve and Elliston volunteer teams respond to the community for chest pain, breathing problems or pre-existing medical conditions, and on occasion, trauma cases.

Central Eyre Peninsula Regional Team Leader Campbell Forsyth said volunteers nominated themselves on the roster when it suited them.

"We train regularly so volunteers are always prepared to answer the call when it comes," Campbell said.

"Cleve and Elliston teams are both hard working small teams supporting their communities. They would welcome any new recruits," Campbell said.

Come and meet the Elliston team at the Elliston Oval on Saturday 15 April from 12-4pm. SAAS and CFS volunteers will be there for the public to come and have a look at what they do.

Volunteers gain experience and nationally-recognised qualifications in pre-hospital care, meet new people and support their communities.

New recruits do a combination of online and face-to-face training, and are always paired with a qualified officer while on a call.

"SAAS provides training, uniform and reimburses out of pocket costs such as travel and childcare," Campbell said.

"Some of our people have gone onto careers in health, in a variety of positions, after receiving an insight into the sector through volunteering for SAAS," he said.

A fully qualified volunteer Ambulance Officer is awarded a Certificate IV in Healthcare once their training is complete.

Volunteers and their families also receive free Ambulance Cover whilst volunteering for their communities with SAAS.
