MORNING TEA THANK YOU TO BREAKFAST CLUB VOLUNTEERS

On Tuesday, the 4th of July, we thanked the many volunteers who helped serve breakfast to approx. sixty students a week with a morning tea at Pink Door.

Each Tuesday, our volunteers hand out over a hundred and twenty halves of toasted ham and cheese sandwiches, plus three loaves of toast. We have vegemite and homemade jam provided. We begin and finish a term with homemade pancakes and crumpets, and this week handed out 100 pancakes and 50 crumpets.

The students love breakfast club because of the yummy food provided and the friendly and kind service our volunteers provide.

For some students, it makes for a great start to their day, and they look forward to school on Tuesday because of the breakfast club. Some parents have even told us it's the most easiest morning to get their child to school.



We welcome Lori Fogarty to Our Ag teaching staff for the rest of the year and farewell to Tim Collins. Cleve is Lori's first teaching appointment, teaching Years 7, 9, and 10 Ag this semester. Lori grew up on Lucy Creek station, north east of Alice Springs, but knows SA well as she went to school and Uni in Adelaide. Please make Lori feel welcome.

And we wish farewell to Tim Collins and thank him for his fantastic work this year teaching Ag (and his work last year). Many students have told me they have enjoyed his teaching, and he has set a great foundation with the students preparing sheep and goats for the Adelaide Show. Tim is still around, and we'll see him in and around the school, helping us look after animals and doing the odd relief day. We had mixed news over the holidays with a hatch and a dispatch. We welcomed two new new kids to our goat family, but one only lived a day and died from what we think was a condition it had at birth. So we are taking 10 wether goats and one mother to the show.

The sheep wethers were looked after very well by the students over the holidays and now need to be reminded how to be led as they've had a fortnight without being handled and are a bit flighty. You'll see the sheep team walking around the town often now leading up to the show on the 5th of September.

The Ag Program is complete already this term: Out at Sims Farm, post-emergent spraying has been done on all crops, and over the next couple of weeks, Tony and the students will be spraying out UAN and fungicides. Things are pretty dry, so much so that the barley in Fulback was wilting last week.

The Show Sheep team will attend a Livestock Education Day at Jamestown on Monday next week, and the Year 11 Ag Students will attend Glenville's Ram Sale on Tuesday.

The Year 7s will take over looking after and learning about the dozen Isa Brown Chickens we now have in their nicely renovated Chicken Shed (work was done by the Mens Shed last year). The year 7s will also build wicking garden beds (thanks to Parents and Friends and Sims Farm for funding the upgrade) in the Ag garden area and hopefully grow some lovely veggies before the end of the year.

In the last week of last term, some of our year 11s and 12s completed their CFS Level 1 Basic Firefighting training.

Your child may be involved in the RST Chemical Course & Upcoming Welding & Machinery Maintenance and Livestock Production training.



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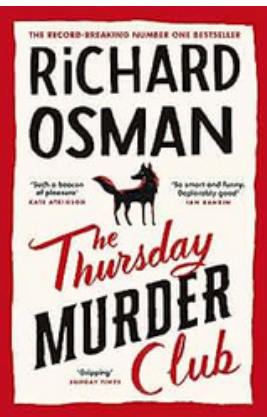


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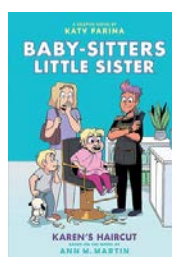
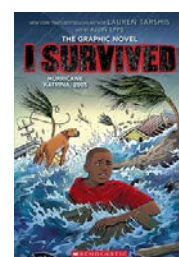
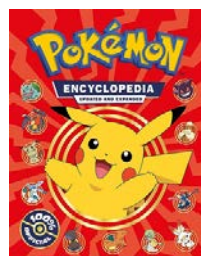
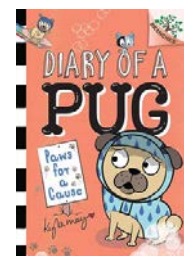
