We are currently conducting the Progressive Achievement Tests (PAT) in Reading and Mathematics to gauge the academic progress of our students from Year 1 to 10. Each student will complete two tests (one reading, one maths) over the next three weeks. These assessments are a valuable tool to help us understand each student's strengths and areas where they may need additional support. The testing procedure is less rigorous than NAPLAN, but the results are appreciated as they can be collected every year to provide consistent progress tracking. Staff consider this data in combination with results like NAPLAN to ensure every student is being provided with the best support & challenge to help them succeed.

I would like to acknowledge our dedicated Ag team, including John Solly, Lori Fogarty, Tim Collins, and Feebi Hazelgrove, who have devoted so much time over the past six months to preparing our sheep and goats for entry into the Adelaide Show. As we get most of our information about the program from them, it is generally focused on the input of the students and their successes. However, I know that it has been made possible by the work of the team behind them. I am sure they will achieve excellent results while competing at the show this week and these accomplishments are a testament to the teamwork, dedication, and passion that our Ag team and students have poured into this endeavour.

SA Ambulance Service

SA Ambulance Service is looking for volunteers at Cleve and Cowell stations. We want to share the experiences of our volunteers with you – in the hope that you might be interested in joining!

One of our newer SAAS faces at Cleve is Nicolle Harris. She joined the Cleve SA Ambulance Volunteer team this year and uses her health skills to help her community.



"I feel SAAS is such an important group to be a part of, and it provides such a sense of satisfaction and pride giving back to those in a time of need," Nicolle said.

"The ongoing training, theory, and workshops SAAS provides are fantastic. The Cleve station meets weekly for training, so we are continuously learning new skills and updating techniques," she said.

Nicolle said she was working through the training, starting with Ambulance Assist.

"AA involves driving and providing basic assistance, then moving to more clinical levels," she said.

The time commitment is often cited as a barrier to participation as a volunteer. However, rosters are flexible; you can nominate yourself on the roster.

"All Cleve members either work full-time or part-time, have families, and run our businesses," Nicolle said.

"So for these individuals to still give back to their communities in a volunteering role is an incredible effort," she said.

"Not all members are from a clinical background so anyone can join, and training is provided." People join SAAS at many stages of their lives and from varying backgrounds. Training and uniforms are free, and out-of-pocket costs such as fuel are reimbursed.

Volunteers learn more than just medical skills; they meet new people, improve leadership skills, and get to know their communities.
