Secondary Reporting

As we prepare to transition to the EMS at the end of the year, we will be revising and updating some of our policies to better match what this system will allow us to accomplish. One of the biggest changes for parents will be to reporting, especially in the secondary. In anticipation, this Term the usual secondary interim report will be replaced by an additional traffic light for Years 7-11. Year 12 students will receive a full written report as in previous years, which is their final report before receiving results from SACE. This will better align Semester 1 & 2 reporting and will function similarly to the system we have next year with the EMS.

Online Safety

I have dealt with a few incidents already this year concerning students who are taking pictures of other people and posting them online without permission. In an era dominated by social media, it's crucial for our students to understand the importance of cyber safety, especially when it comes to sharing other people's pictures online. Your digital footprint is a reflection of who you are, and respecting others' privacy is paramount. We would appreciate it if all parents could discuss with their children the importance of seeking permission before posting someone else's photo, and remind them that once it's online, it can be challenging to remove and it is impossible to control who will see it once it. As well as the potential harm this can cause others, there are serious consequences for students who are bullying others or being disrespectful – whether it is online or in person.

On a more positive note, I was extremely proud to be part of the Cleve Area School Pedal Prix team on the weekend. A 24 hr race is an incredible test of endurance and a great opportunity for the students involved to practice their perseverance in some very trying circumstances. The junior team had some inspiring individual efforts to help the others catch some sleep- Mitchell Peters was staying out as long as some of the senior boys, and Rhys Lister hopped in the bike more than anyone else during the toughest Midnight-6 am period – and the team as a whole worked together and kept up the encouragement despite sleeping in 2-3 hr stints at most. The senior team amazed me with their ability to push themselves to their limits and achieved a remarkable 8th place for their category out of 46 entrants. To give this some context, we were one of only 5 public schools in the top 20, and of those the only Area school. A great example of what our students can achieve with some hard work and the support of their parents & the community!




