This year has seen us make some significant changes as we invest in our ICT infrastructure. The highlights for me include:


- ·Staff Devices: Equipping our staff with the latest technology for improved teaching and administration.

## **AG NEWS**

Last Wednesday, Year 11 Ag students Josh Crosby, and Samuel Hannemann shore the ewe lambs, with wool handling assistance from Hannah Evans & Connor Brumfield. The Year 11s also weaned the lambs off the ewes, ready for the wether lambs to be sold next week. The ewe lambs will be classed in a few weeks and added to our self-replacing merino mob.

It's been a tough year for the crops at Sims Farm this year, having received 172mm since January 1st. Harvest started a fortnight ago: Butler peas yielded 400kg/ha from Lochie Elleway and Samuel Hannemann's Footrot Flats paddock and Connor Brumfield's Bottom paddock.

The header is now in the two canola paddocks (Dave and Audreys) that were sown by Hamish Turner, Kale Roberts, and Jason Thompson. Aaron Bammann began reaping Daves this morning. As harvest is early this year, the Year 11s will have an opportunity to harvest their own paddocks.

Ken Solly delivered Ag business planning & finance sessions to the Year 11s. He has given them gross margin and cash flow tasks to work on to finish the year. The Year 7s with Ms Fogarty and Kerry Smith have nearly completed wicking beds ready for next year planting vegetables. Unfortunately, the garden soil has been delivered too late for the year 7s to grow vegetables before the end of the year. But we are very pleased they'll be ready to use for many years to come.

We have 100 layer chickens that the Year 7 and 9 classes are raising and will be available for sale at the end of the term. We have 50 Isa brown, 25 black Austalorp and 25 white Leghorn layers for sale. They should be ready to lay their first eggs on about Christmas day. Put your orders in at the front office - max 6 birds per
