## Deputy News

I would like to welcome everyone new and returning, to the 2024 school year. We have lots of new staff, students and families joining our school, including three students from Brazil joining our Year lo class for the first semester. We hope that this is an excellent experience for them and appreciate the opportunity for our students to get some experience with another language and culture.

As we will hopefully be seeing some warmer weather soon, a reminder that the school policy is for broadbrim hats to be worn year-round (not just Terms l\&4) when students are outside. Please make sure your child has a suitable hat at school every day, otherwise they will be required to stay in designated undercover areas during break times. The front office has hats available for purchase if required.

The earlier timeslot for NAPLAN means it will be here before we know it for students in Years 3 , 5 , 7 \& 9 Students will complete the first component, Writing, on Wednesday Week 7 (13/3), and the remaining components before Monday, Week 9 (25/3). If you have children in these year levels, please try to keep these dates free so that the data collected gives us the best representation of our students' progress.

This year we are trialling a change to the structure of Parent/Teacher interviews. We will be running them over two nights, from 3:30-6:30. We hope that by narrowing the time frame that all teachers can be accessible to parents at a consistent time and we can provide later timeslots for those parents who haven't been able to make our traditional times. Further information for bookings will come out in the coming weeks, but in the meantime please keep the 19/3 and $20 / 3$ (Tue/Wed Wk 8) clear. 1 hope to see as many of you as possible there. As always, if you want to meet with a teacher at any time, please contact the school and it can be arranged.

This year continues our implementation of Chromebook devices for Years 4-6. As we have Year 3 s joining the Year 4s, this year the school will be providing devices to the Year 3 students to ensure consistent access for all students in the class. We were very fortunate to receive the Chromebooks we needed for this as part of a trial with Allied Corporation, which is a PC building company based in Adelaide that is building Chromebooks for the first time. You might have even heard us mentioned on the news as one of only two schools involved in this trial! We also have new interactive displays in all classrooms and devices for staff in preparation for the implementation of Daymaplater in the year. l would like to thank Meredith Ramsey and Greg Preiss for the many hours they have put in over the holidays to get these ready before everyone returned. They consistently go above and beyond to ensure our students have access to the latest technology to enhance their learning.

While l'm on technology, at the end of last year, l shared information with our Year 7 families on the school's BYOD program, which allows them to use a laptop device of their choice on the school network. The information is repeated in this newsletter for other families new to the secondary or with students needing a new device and will be posted to Dojo. If you have a student that is in Years 7-12, then access to their own device is highly beneficial. Please get in touch with me if you have any questions about this program. A reminder that Department policy does not allow for students to use personal devices such as phones, tablets or smartwatches as an alternative to their laptop during school time

Finally, I wanted to talk a little bit about the training that the Department's Support and lnclusion Division ran for us last week as we prepared for the new year. The focus was on supporting gender diverse, intersex and sexually diverse children and young people and it provided us with the latest advice and expectations from the Department in this area. While a component of the training was on how to respond to individual student needs, it was also made clear that the onus is on us to ensure we are providing a supportive environment for all students, regardless of any identified needs that we may know about. A simple example of a step we can take to provide this is by minimising the use of gendered groupings in our classes.
