## Principal News

Hi all, just a short newsletter this week to get back on track and inform you of a few happenings which are occurring in the near future.

## Buses

We are going to trial moving the bus pick up point at the end of the day to the carpark next to the kindy. The safety of our students is the most important thing in making this decision. There have been some close calls in front of the school at the end of day with students and parents crossing the road between buses, cars travelling past buses, and buses leaving at different times passing parked vehicles.
From tonight, students are going to be walking along the footpath in front of the kindy to access the buses at the end of the day to eliminate all students walking down between the buses. Buses will be able to continue to park in the shade of the trees along the front of the school during the day to get some shade.
This means that parents will not be able to park in the carpark next to the kindy to pick up their children at the end of the day as the buses will now be leaving from this carpark. Parking is available along Edwards Terrace (closest to Primary), Third Street (closest to Secondary) and in the extended car park on the corner of East Terrace and Birdseye highway (on the old asphalt courts).

## Bus Routes

It was requested at the Governing Council meeting if we could arrange a meeting for any concerns with bus routes to be discussed in the one place at the one time. All routes are encouraged to discuss any issues which they currently have and either personally attend or send some representatives to attend the meeting on Monday 26th February at 5:30pm in the staffroom.
A couple of bus routes have parent messenger pages and may be able to share this method of communication. We would also like to have a school representative and the bus driver within these groups to help make the communication easier in case of a breakdown, etc.

## Governing Council AGM

At the Governing Council meeting this week (it was great to see a couple of new faces there), it was decided to have the AGM on Tuesday 26th March, 5:30pm at the Cleve Hotel. Emma Nield was heard to say, "It would be great to have lots of new parents attend, even if it's for a look and listen before deciding if they would like to join".
To support this, the school is very pleased to be having our three Brazilian exchange students come along on the night to talk to us about Brazil and their experience so far in being hosted in the Cleve District.

## Swimming Carnival

The Year 4-12 Swimming Carnival is on Friday, 23rd February with fingers crossed we aren't impacted by the weather. Practices began at lunchtime last Wednesday and numbers for all houses have been excellent. Last year was a very close finish with Kahibah just holding off Nurrugy by 10 points to be champions with all houses within just 55 points. Cooranga House were the Team Spirit Shield winners. It will be great for Killara and Nurrugy Houses to feature in a shield award in 2024. A reminder, the Team Spirit Award shield is awarded throughout the year at each house sporting competition. Students are judged on how well they participate, cheer and support their team. Students are encouraged to dress up in their team colours at the carnival and come up with chants/war cries. However, a standard of dress suitable for attendance at a school function and swimming is required and because of the effect on chemical levels, students are asked not to put dyes in hair and to ensure any 'body paint' applied is safe.
Students will meet at the pool at 8.50 a.m. for Home Group whilst competition commences at $9.05 \mathrm{a} . \mathrm{m}$. and concludes in time for the usual departure of buses. There will be a lunch break from approximately $12.30 \mathrm{pm}-1.00 \mathrm{pm}$. Catering will be provided at the pool on the day with final details regarding menus and prices promoted over the next week.
The Program will be posted on the school Facebook and Dojo sites whilst hard copies will be available to interested parents from Wednesday (21st February) at the front office, or at Swimming Carnival.

The Swimming Carnival is a normal school day and all students are expected to attend. If not able to swim there are still many roles students can help fulfil throughout the day.
We hope you are able to support the occasion by attending for at least part of the day. For many years now we've had a great number of spectators which has provided excellent support and created an exciting atmosphere for the students.

To help clarify queries about the Swimming Carnival the following is an outline of how the day is organised. The carnival is split into the following:
Individual Championship Events
Races designed to cater for 'stronger' swimmers with one competitor from each house in each race swimming:
Freestyle, Breast Stroke, Butterfly (Open only) and Backstroke.
-All races are 34m (2 laps)
Individual Medley (Backstroke, Breaststroke, Freestyle)
$\bullet \boxtimes$ Sub Junior and Junior are 17m (1 lap) each leg
$\bullet$-lnter and Senior are 34m (2 laps) each leg.
Age Events
Races designed for all competitors regardless of their swimming ability. An unlimited number of competitors are able to compete in heats at the start of the day. The fastest four swimmers in each stroke, in each age group, regardless of house, go through to a final. All races are 17m (1 lap) - all age groups do Breast Stroke, Backstroke and Freestyle.

## Team Novelty Events

Races designed first and foremost to encourage non-swimmers and beginner swimmers to 'have a go'.

- Ring Relay - mixed teams for sub junior and junior
- Tube Relay - mixed teams for sub junior, junior, intermediate and senior
- Peg Scramble - mixed teams for sub junior, junior and intermediate
- Ball Dribble - mixed teams for intermediate and senior
- Chariot Race - mixed sub junior and senior combined.
- Noodle Race - mixed sub junior and senior combined.

Relays
Team Freestyle and Medley relays with teams of four competitors from each house.

- Sub junior and junior legs are 17 m , intermediate and senior are 34 m

House meetings will be held next Monday to enable Leaders to finalise teams. Every effort is made by House Captains, Vice Captains and supervising teachers to ensure all students are able to participate in at least three events. Hopefully an individual's events will be spread out throughout the day but this isn't always possible. Primary students will record their events in diaries after House Meetings.
