Daymap will allow for big improvements in how we keep you informed about your child's progress and class activities. No more waiting until the end of the semester for a report! With ongoing reporting, you'll receive updates on your child's achievements, assessments, and attendance throughout the semester. The pupil free day will allow us the time to practise using all aspects of the system so we can have the smoothest possible start to our usage in Term 2. This is going to be a big change for all our staff, and eventually parents as well, so we want to get it right. Teachers & Admin staff will be implementing the system next term, and parents will gain access for reporting in Semester 2. Our current reporting system remains in place for Semester 1. The eagerly awaited 2022 and 2023 school magazines are scheduled for final preparation next term and, once complete, they will be available for order. As head of the Magazine Committee I'd like to extend my sincerest apologies for the delays in getting these out and promise that systems are now in place to ensure prompt delivery of 2024 and future magazines.

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Interschool Sports Day

This year Cleve Area School is hosting the annual E.E.P.A.S.S.A Interschool Sports Day on Wednesday (3rd April) at the Cleve Town Oval. The carnival involves participation from students at the Cummins, Lock, Cleve, Cowell, Tumby Bay, Wudinna and Kimba schools.

This is a major event on our calendar and a great opportunity for students to compete against their peers and represent our school. It takes a great deal of organisation and coordinating and we rely on the commitment and support of the school and broader community.

Parents of students participating have been sent a letter outlining arrangements for the day. Students need to arrive at school as usual and will then walk to the oval under teacher supervision. Parents are able to take their children directly to the oval but they should not be dropped off before 9.10 a.m. as there will be limited teacher supervision prior to this time.

The Opening Ceremony is programmed for 9.30 a.m. with events beginning at 9.45 a.m. We are excited to have the day opened by ex-student Bella Smith who was a keen athlete at school and is currently playing AFLW with the Sydney Swans. Providing the day goes to plan, the presentations will occur at 3.10 p.m. As we cannot guarantee returning to the school before buses depart, students travelling on buses need to either return to school earlier with staff supervision or make alternative arrangements for travelling home.

Competitors will need to ensure they wear our official school sports tops, and sports gear, along with suitable warm clothing (e.g. school windcheater).

Parents and Friends, Year 9 Canberra Trip and the SRC are catering for the day providing lunch, drinks and snacks at the venue. It would be great to support these groups so bring along some spending money.

Admission for adults is \$5.00. Programmes will be available for \$2.00 at the gate.

All adult spectators are welcome to view the events, but must keep the track and central arena clear.

If weather conditions are unsuitable (heat rule is 38 degrees or higher on BOM Weather for Cleve), and the Interschool Sports Day has to be postponed, an announcement will be made as early as possible with the carnival held later that week.

We will be setting up shades, bunting and other equipment on Tuesday (2nd April) from 9.00 am. Any help would be greatly appreciated, even if just for an hour or two – please leave your name at the front office if you're able to assist!

I hope that many parents, friends and community members will stop by to support our competitors. As the host school, we are responsible for officiating the track. If you haven't already registered your interest and are willing to help out with timing and/or place judging the track for part of the day, please contact me.

We look forward to seeing you on the day.

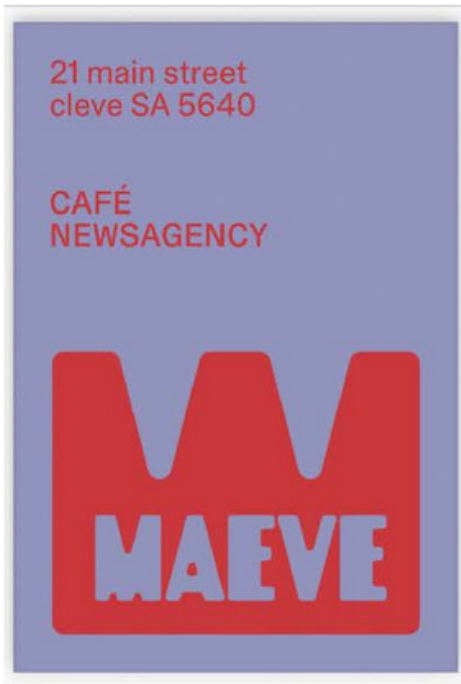

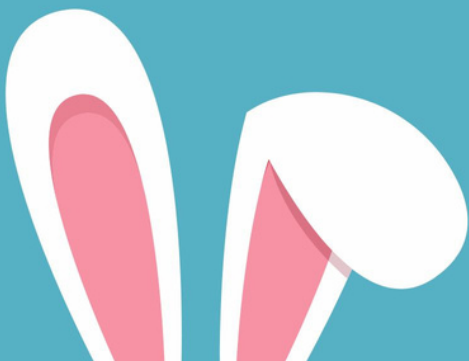
