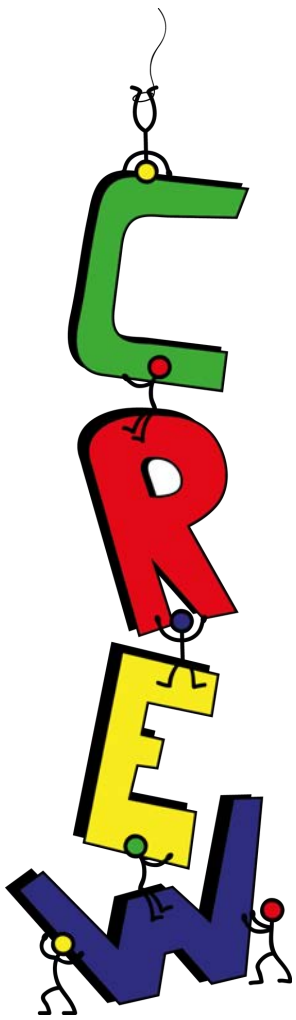
Ava Jenner (Year 12) recently completed a School-based Certificate III in Business Traineeship with the District Council of Cleve 1

WELLBEING WONDERS

With resources for Mental Health often scarce in rural communities, we thought we would share some favourites over the next few newsletters that are most easily accessible for you and your families.

HEADSPACE

If you're a young person and looking for information on mental health, Headspace is a great place to start.

Whilst there may be wait periods to talk to someone at a Headspace centre, headspace do have a fantastic online platform. They are open from 9am – 1am, 7 days a week for a 1-on-1 chat with a trained clinician. It's a confidential, free and safe space to talk about what's going on.

You can also access a variety of safe and supportive online community chats that provide a great way to connect with other young people, family and friends with similar experiences to you. The site also enables you to build your own personalised mental health toolkit where you can design your own avatar, collect and save resources that are helpful to you.

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Answer the call – Join the Cleve Volunteer Ambulance Team today. SA Ambulance Service (SAAS) has launched its volunteer recruitment campaign, Answer the Call and is looking for more volunteers in the region. Around 1200 SAAS volunteers provide ambulance services in 77 locations across the state including at Cleve, Port Neill and Cowell. The Cleve, Port Neill and Cowell volunteer teams respond to the community for chest pain, breathing problems or pre-existing medical conditions, and on occasion, trauma cases. SAAS Operations Manager, Tori Buter said the campaign is off to a great start focusing on the Far North, West Coast, Mid North and Yorke areas. “It’s great to see the campaign launched in this area, our volunteers are excited to meet new recruits and support them through their training,” Tori said. To help spread the message of volunteering SAAS has nominated two of its local volunteers, Quinn Adams and Shane Davey to act as campaign ambassadors. “Both locals, Quinn and Shane will provide another level of personal connection to people thinking about volunteering with us,” Tori said. SAAS volunteers are called on during times of need and have excellent standing in regional communities. 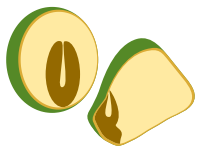
